School Description

Eagle Rock Junior/Senior High School (ERHS) is an International Baccalaureate, IBO World School, located between the cities of Pasadena and Glendale in the northeastern tip of Los Angeles. Eagle Rock is one of eighty-eight public high schools in the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), the second largest school district in the nation. ERHS is one of only two span schools in the entire district with a 7-12 grade configuration, housing both a comprehensive junior and senior high school. Its magnet program serves gifted, high ability and highly gifted students in grades 7-12.

ERHS was the first school in the district to implement the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), a rigorous combination of integrated and accelerated college level courses across all disciplines, that along with advanced analysis, requires post-secondary research, exploration, and independent study. ERHS is one of seven International Baccalaureate World Schools within LAUSD and offers the Middle Years Programme to all students grades 7-10. All 11th and 12th grade students have access to the Diploma Programme, or they can instead opt for a combination of separate, Advanced Placement college-level coursework customized to their specific areas of interest.

Accreditation Western Association of Schools and Colleges

Eagle Rock has been named one of the top 113 high schools in all of Los Angeles County, including both public and private schools. The school is ranked #233 among all California High Schools by the U.S. News & World Report and has earned a silver medal based on student performance on state-required tests and on how well students are prepared for college.

Marking System

The Los Angeles Unified School District GPA is based on a 4-point scale. Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are given in all credit classes. Students who successfully complete a semester of an AP course or Honors Level International Baccalaureate (grade of C or better) receive an additional augmented 0.025 points. One semester class is equivalent to five credits. For the purposes of class rank, the district calculates a student's GPA from courses taken in grades 9-12.

Covid-19 Impact

On March 13th, 2020, all LAUSD high schools were closed for the remainder of the semester and work was completed remotely. While letter grades were retained, due to a significant number of families with little or no access to the internet or technology for weeks, no student could be assigned a failing grade. Students could improve their grades, but they could not fall below their 10 week mark.

In the Fall of 2020, we returned to a regular A-F grading system, but were remote learning only. While our administration provided access to technology including Chromebooks and hot-spots, many students experienced frequent and varying technology issues. Due to this digital divide the district implemented a policy that allowed students to use a "Pass/No Pass" (P/NP) grade for some or all classes for the 2020-21 school year only.

In April 2021, students were invited to return to campus but remained in online learning for the rest of the academic year. In the Fall of 2021 we returned to a fully on campus experience with a regular A-F grading system.

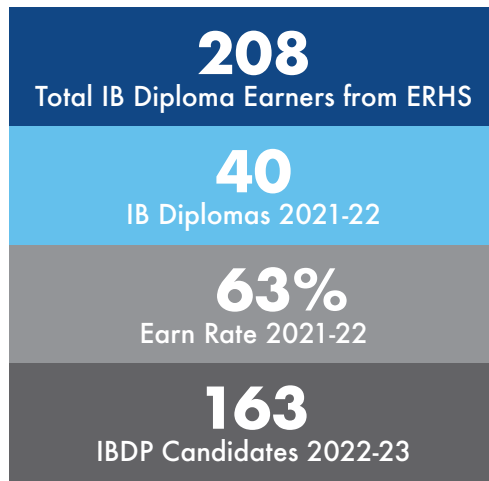

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

ERHS is one of seven International Baccalaureate World Schools within LAUSD. In the 2021-22 school year, the IB Diploma was awarded to 40 of 64 ERHS IBDP students, an earn rate of 63%. Since 2016, the overall earn rate is 57% with 208 total Diploma earners to date. Currently, there are 163 junior and senior IBDP candidates enrolled in the program and 8 course candidates.
