- U.S. News ranks Eagle Rock Jr./Sr. High School with a score of 94.31/100, which is 20/249 (top 8%) in LAUSD, 148/2494 (top 6%) in California and 981/23,000 (top 4%) nationally. - Volleyball won Northern League Championship for the 10th consecutive time for girls and 11th for boys!
- Girls Tennis repeated as Division 1 City Champs! Girls & Boys tennis were Northern League Champs!
- JV Football was undefeated as Northern League Champions. Varsity Football competed at the highest level in school history, with a win in the Open Division.
- Girls Cross Country was Div. 2 City Champions, James was Division 2 XC City Champion, and Mr. R. Martinez was named Cross Country Coach of the Year!
- Girls & Boys Wrestling were Northern League Champs! Karla & Jenny went to State!
- Our Special Olympics/Unified baseball team played well in our inaugural season!
- Girls & Boys basketball won Northern League! Boys Basketball team was Division 2 City Champions, with Mr. C. Dunbar named Coach of the Year and senior Mitchell named Player of the Year!
- In aquatics, City Champions are Johanna in the 500 freestyle and Kailee in the 50 and 100 freestyle. Girls & Boys swim won Northern League and Girls & Boys Water Polo won Eastern League.
- In softball, Nicolette earned back-to-back Player of the Year honors and is headed to play at Dayton!
- Girls and boys soccer had tremendous seasons; Goalie Veronica will be headed to play at UC Merced!
- Track City Champions include James in the 3200, John in the F/S Ling Jump and Julian in the F/S 400!

On June 5, 2019, **345** of our eighth graders were eligible for culmination! That is a **97%** culmination rate! Thank you to our ASB, middle school coach Mr. Elizondo, counselors, Ms. Cannata and Mr. Magana, and Latin Jazz Band for a lovely ceremony! On June 6, 2019, **403** of our seniors graduated! That is a **98%** graduation rate! In our Magnet, the graduation rate was **100%**! Thank you to Senior AP Ms. Figueroa-Calderon, Counselor Ms. Amirouche, College Counselor Ms. Mena, and Sponsor Ms. Villegas! Thank you to our graduates, families and school, especially Mr. Christ, Ms. Gallegos, Mr. Laird, Mr. Lord, Ms. Manrique, Ms. Orellana, Mr. Oswald, and Ms. Silverman for an incredible ceremony! We are grateful with our partnership with Mr. Tranquada from Occidental College! More Basilians Class of 2019 highlights:

- **120** of our seniors earned the California State Seal for Bi-literacy for studying and excelling in more than one language (English and Spanish, French or German). Thank you to our Language & Literature (English) and Language Acquisition (Foreign Language) teachers!
- Many earned Golden State Merit Diploma awarded jointly by the State Board of Education and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Student diplomas have a gold poppy seal for demonstrating mastery with high honors in at least six high school subject areas. Several earned a silver seal on their diplomas for a GPA of 3.0-3.49 or a gold seal on their diplomas for a GPA of 3.5 or above. Over 15% earned the LAUSD Superintendent's award for a GPA of 3.5 or above in A-G courses and wore a purple cord in honor of former LAUSD Superintendent Dr. Michelle King.
- Our top five students will be heading to Stanford, UCLA, or Yale in the Fall,
- Katie, Charles and Brandon had perfect attendance in 9th -12th. Vanessa and Robert had perfect attendance from 7th-12th!
- Two of our Career and Technical Education pathways celebrated our seniors: 1) Thank you to Graphic Arts teacher Mr. Laird for designing and producing twenty senior commitment banners displayed on Yosemite Drive; it was a pilot project that we hope to expand next year. Thank you as well to Bronson Photography for donating the photos! 2) Congratulations to Video Production teacher Mr. Cohen and our ERHS video team for producing our live stream graduation ceremony! 




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Kindness Matters-What might be some of the work that you are doing to make our school, community, and world a better place for you and others?
