



Final Product:



KENYA



- careful making of beadwork
- many use of bright colors



- Wearing heavy earings to elongate ears
- the longer the earlors the more "beautiful"

Maasai Tribe:

- use lots of beaded jewelry pieces around the neck & arms
- both men & women wear metal rings on their stretched earlobes
- intricate face paintings and distinct hairstyles
- headresses from animal skins + feathers
- tie jewelry everywhere + shaved heads



TRIBES FROM KENYA:

- traditionally dressed in animal skins which consist of red sheets
- either with barefoot or with simple sandals

Kenyan Tribes:

- extensive use of colored jewlery
- the more jewlery one wears, the higher in rank you are

- tie jewelry everywhere + shaved heads





